### Mathematical Vocabulary

**Digital clock** – A clock or watch that shows the time using numbers, not hands.

### This week's mathematical point ...

#### Inverse

$$10 - 3 = 7$$

$$7 + 3 = 10$$

$$23 - 2 = 21$$

$$21 + 2 = 23$$

$$19 - 6 = 13$$

$$13 + 6 = 19$$

$$4 + 3 = 7$$

$$7 - 3 = 4$$

Inverse means the **opposite in effect** (the reverse of).

The inverse of adding is subtracting. Adding moves us one way; subtracting moves us the opposite way. We can work out related number facts using the opposite operation. For example, if we know that  $7 + 3 = 10$ , we can subtract the three from ten to get back to seven. This gives us the related subtraction fact  $10 - 3 = 7$ .

We can find other related facts by swapping the numbers around. For example, we can also use the number bond  $3 + 7 = 10$ , then work backwards by taking away the seven from ten to get 3, giving us the subtraction fact  $10 - 7 = 3$ .
