Mathematical Vocabulary

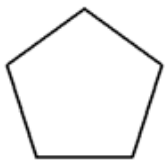
Irregular polygon – A shape that does not have all sides equal and all angles equal.

This week's mathematical point ...

Polygons

A polygon is a plane shape (two-dimensional) with straight sides. This includes shapes such as triangles, rectangles and pentagons.

Regular shapes are shapes where all angles are equal and all sides are equal, otherwise it is irregular. Examples of irregular and regular shapes are shown below.



Regular Pentagon



Irregular Pentagons



Regular Hexagon



Irregular Hexagons



Regular Octagon



Irregular Octagons

Regular shapes are easy to identify as they always look the same. We can identify irregular polygons by counting the number of sides and/or vertices.
