Making Plurals – Words Ending in 'O'

When making words **ending in 'o' plural, add an 's' if there is a vowel before the final 'o'**.

For example: zoo becomes zoos.

If there is a **consonant before the final 'o' add 'es'**

For example: hero becomes heroes.

If the word is connected to music then just add an 's'.

The word photo also just needs an 's'.

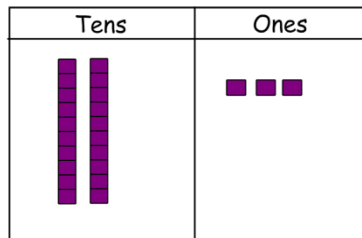
Mathematical Vocabulary

Place value – refers to the value of a digit in a number. For example, in the number 25, the 2 is worth 20 and the 5 is worth 5.

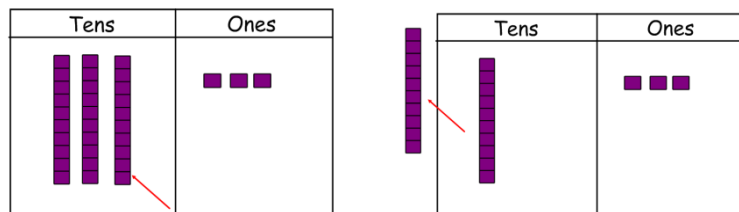
This week's mathematical point ...

Adding and subtracting multiples of 10

Once the children have a secure grasp of the value of digits in a number they can then begin to calculate using them. They use ten sticks and unit cubes to represent numbers as shown in the diagram below which displays the number 23.



We can demonstrate that to add 10, we simply add a stick of 10 to the tens column which does not affect the ones. Similarly, we can subtract 10 by removing a stick of 10 from the tens column. In both cases the ones column is unaffected and they stay the same, as shown below.



Once children understand this pattern, they can begin to calculate mentally, adding any given multiple of 10 to a number. This mental calculation will then support them when they begin to use more formal written methods including number lines.
